AN ORDINANCE TO UPDATE BUSINESS LICENSE FEES FOR THE TRANSFER AND STORAGE COMPANIES LICENSING CATEGORY AND THE SECURITY SERVICES LICENSING CATEGORY, AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS

Summary: Amends LVMC Chapter 6.04 to
update fees for the Transfer and Storage
Companies licensing category and the Security
Services licensing category.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS
FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Title 6, Chapter 4, Section 20, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las
Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

6.04.020: Businesses within the following licensing categories shall pay an annual license fee of fifty
dollars:

Barber or cosmetology, which is any person or establishment that is licensed or required to be
licensed pursuant to the provisions of NRS Chapter 643 or 664 and that offers barber or cosmetology services
to the general public. The fee amount shall be charged for each customer chair or station provided for a
licensed professional.

Billiard or pool hall, with the fee amount to be charged for each billiard or pool table.

Bowling center, which is a business providing a place to engage in the sport of bowling. The fee
amount shall be charged for each alley.

Express delivery service, which is any business providing a transport of goods from one location to
another location for a fee. The license fee shall be charged for the first vehicle used in the business, and a
thirty dollar annual fee to be charged for each additional vehicle used in the business. An applicant for this
license may be required by the Director to furnish a State license or certificate, if applicable, or written
verification that such license or certificate is not required.

Interactive entertainment center, which is any establishment whose primary purpose is to provide

1 technology enabled interactive entertainment, including, but not limited to, motion simulation, networked
2 multi-site multi-player games, multi-media, and virtual reality based games for use by patrons of the
3 establishment. The fee amount shall be charged for each playing station or payment receptacle that pertains
4 to a game, multi-media or computer-related activity, devices or other form of entertainment. Any other type
5 of business to be conducted on the premises, including any separate-leased area of the premises, must be
6 separately licensed and is subject to any background investigation applicable thereto.

7 **Nonprofit commercial enterprise**, which is any commercial enterprise regularly engaged in by an
8 organization that has duly qualified as tax exempt under the Internal Revenue Code. The category does not
9 include an organization whose commercial activities consist solely of one or more of the following:

10 (A) Occasional fundraising activities;

11 (B) Solicitation activities that are governed by the provisions of State law pertaining to solicitation
12 by nonprofit organizations; or

13 (C) The sale of items that are intended to convey a religious, political or ideological message.

14 **[Transfer and storage company**, which is any business providing transportation and storage of
15 household goods, commercial goods or other commodities. The fee amount shall be charged for the first truck
16 used in the business, and a thirty dollar annual fee to be charged for each additional truck used in the
17 business.]

18 SECTION 2: Title 6, Chapter 4, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada,
19 1983 Edition, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, designated as Section 25, reading as
20 follows:

21 **6.04.025:** Businesses within the following license categories shall pay an annual license fee of
22 seventy dollars:

23 **Moving Company**, which is any business providing transportation and storage of household goods,
24 commercial goods or other commodities. The fee amount shall be charged for each vehicle or mobile storage
25 container used for this purpose.

26 SECTION 3: Title 6, Chapter 4, Section 40, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las

Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

6.04.040: Businesses within the following license categories shall pay an annual license fee of two hundred dollars:

Adult day care facility, which is an establishment operated and maintained to provide care, for not more than twelve hours at a time, on a temporary or permanent basis for aged or infirm persons.

Administrative or corporate office space, which is an office location in which specific administrative functions or centralized functions of a business are conducted apart from the primary or affiliated business entities, whether the business operations of those entities are conducted at that location or elsewhere.

Carwash, which is a stationary business that offers services to clean cars by either coin operation or direct payment, whether or not it is operated in conjunction with another business. The services offered may include the washing, waxing, cleaning and detailing of motor vehicles by human effort.

Construction related services, which is any business that removes construction materials from construction sites for transportation to a disposal site, provides ancillary services to construction projects such as equipment used to pump or disperse concrete or construction related services which do not require a license per NRS Chapter 624. For purposes of this category, "construction materials" includes without limitation wood, plaster, metals, asphaltic substances, brick, block, concrete, excavation dirt, rock, stone and gravel.

Designer-draftsman, which is any person who specializes in the planning or execution of the layout, decorations or furnishing for any interior structure, including advice related to or sales of decorator items, window and wall coverings or furnishings, or who prepares drawings or sketches of structures, but who is not acting as an architect under NRS Chapter 623.

Permanent makeup, which is any business that enhances or alters facial characteristics by inserting indelible pigment under the skin or by the production of scars.

Personal services, which is any business that provides personal services, including without limitation a wake-up service, reminder service, errand service, vehicle registration service, personal chef or

1 cook service, or shopping service. The category does not include any service that is designated or included
2 in another category identified in this Title.

3 **Photography business**, which is any business that takes photographs for eventual sale to a client or
4 customer of the business.

5 **Property maintenance provider**, which is any person who provides onsite property maintenance or
6 clean up services, such as, but not limited to the following services: handyman, janitorial, maid, lawn
7 maintenance, pest control, pool and/or spa cleaning, power washing, sewer/septic pumping or cleaning, tree
8 trimming or window cleaning primarily at, in or upon residential structures. This classification does not
9 include activities requiring a contractor's license pursuant to NRS Chapter 624, nor does this classification
10 include activities that primarily includes onsite property maintenance or clean up services at, in or upon
11 commercial structures.

12 **Recreation facility**, which is a business that offers to the public for a fee the use of recreational
13 courts including tennis, handball or similar courts, swimming pool, rock climbing, health or fitness facility a
14 skating facility on any indoor or outdoor surface and includes skating or skateboarding or similar facility.

15 **Rental referral service**, which is any person who provides a listing or referral service for the rental
16 of apartments, equipment, or other types of rentals. The category does not include any person or business
17 that is required to be licensed under NRS Chapter 645.

18 **Riding horse rental**, which is any person who provides riding horses for rent or provides boarding,
19 stabling or training for riding horses.

20 **School**, which is any institution or place of education or instruction, or any individual acting as a
21 tutor, facilitator, trainer or otherwise providing instruction in a skill, except for an institution or individual
22 offering post-secondary education.

23 **Security services**, which is any business that is licensed or required to be licensed pursuant to the
24 provisions of NRS Chapter 648 and that offers private security services.

25 **Shooting range**, which is any business that operates a weapons range for practice, competition,
26 training or instruction other than a law enforcement agency.

1 **Valet parking**, which is any person engaged in providing for customers the service of parking
2 private vehicles in a designated area. The category does not include any person who provides parking services
3 for the customers of a business and is employed by that business.

4 **Vocational rehabilitation counselor**, which is any person who provides the service of counseling
5 clients relative to labor market assessments, job development, job assessments or employer consultation in
6 the area of vocational rehabilitation.

7 SECTION 4: If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase
8 in this ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by
9 any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the
10 remaining portions of this ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council of the City of Las Vegas hereby
11 declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase
12 thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs,
13 sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective.

14 SECTION 5: Whenever in this ordinance any act is prohibited or is made or declared to
15 be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, or whenever in this ordinance the doing of any act is required
16 or the failure to do any act is made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, the doing of
17 such prohibited act or the failure to do any such required act shall constitute a misdemeanor and upon
18 conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or by imprisonment for a term of
19 not more than six months, or by any combination of such fine and imprisonment. Any day of any violation
20 of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

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SECTION 6: All ordinances or parts of ordinances or sections, subsections, phrases, sentences, clauses or paragraphs contained in the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
