ABOUT THE PRE-QUALIFIED MURALIST LIST

The city of Las Vegas Department of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs invited artists to submit their qualifications to paint murals. The intent of the request for qualifications was to create this list of pre-qualified muralists. Artists chosen for the pre-qualified list will be eligible to be considered for upcoming public mural projects throughout the city of Las Vegas. Inclusion in the pre-qualified list will be active for a period of two years, at which point new submissions will be reviewed, and the list updated.

The call for artists was open to local, national, and international artists, artist teams, and organizations. An independent evaluation panel consisting of community members, arts professionals and city stakeholders reviewed the submissions, and selected the 46 artists on this list, based on artistic excellence displayed through past work, professional experience with large-scale painting and experience with community engagement.

The goal of the Public Art Program is to enrich public spaces with creative and thought-provoking works of art. Murals provide beautification and community engagement, and promote community pride. The program wishes to uplift artists and amplify the community's understanding of the diversity of local art, while creating an engaging permanent public art collection for the city of Las Vegas.



SAMEER ASNANI





RYAN BRUNTY





Ryan Brunty is a Las Vegas-based artist and the visionary founder behind the inspiring and deeply personal artistic movement known as Depressed Monsters. Born from a place of profound emotional depth and vulnerability, Depressed Monsters is more than a lifestyle brand, it's a beacon of hope and a steadfast advocate for mental health awareness. In 2012, the brand emerged as a profound response to the loss of Brunty's beloved grandfather to cancer, a tragedy that left him grappling with grief and inner turmoil. It was through the act of creating self-portraits, each infused with raw emotion and unfiltered honesty, that Brunty found solace and salvation. The character born from these portraits, the eponymous Yerman, became an emblem of resilience and an enduring symbol of hope. Brunty's journey has taken him from the depths of his own emotions to mainstream recognition. His work has been showcased on MTV's The Love Experiment, resonating with countless individuals around the world. Depressed Monsters' reach has extended to popular retailers like Hot Topic and its own online platform, where a supportive community finds solace and strength. Ryan Brunty's artistic odyssey is a testament to the healing power of creativity and the transformative potential of self-expression. Through Depressed Monsters, he invites others to embrace their own struggles and find hope in the darkest corners of their hearts.

Las Vegas-based Filipino painter Gig Depio presents the conjunctions of contemporary and historical forces in the form of intense, often large-scale, figurative compositions that explore the convergence of American, Philippine, and Spanish histories at the turn of the 20th century. Depio's paintings reflect a spectator's view of how culture unfolds and evolves in the midst of a global race of rapid technological development. And yet his work simultaneously contemplates one's 'situatedness' in contemporary American society, finding oneself inescapably embedded in its history. Recipient of the 2016 Nevada Arts Council Fellowship Grant in Painting, Depio has exhibited across Nevada, with shows at the Nevada Museum of Art; the University of Nevada, Las Vegas; the University of Nevada, Reno; and the Marjorie Barrick Museum of Art; among others. Depio has been an exponent for public, nonprofit and independent art in Nevada since 2009, and has recently extended his advocacy internationally, including exhibitions with the National Commission for Culture and Arts (NCCA), Manila, Philippines; in Italy at the 58th Venice Biennale in Venice; and in the United Kingdom.





After receiving his Master's degree in Contemporary and Modern Art History in New York, Michael returned to the valley in 2016 and served as the Artist-in-Residence at Opportunity Village's New Opportunities for Visionary Arts (NOVA) initiative, teaching classes to the learning disabled and at the Rogers Foundation. There, Michael taught art classes to at-risk youth through the Foundation CORE Academy. The Rogers Foundation first introduced Michael's artwork to a large-scale format, which eventually stemmed to more opportunities throughout the valley and a partnership with The Fashion Show, Las Vegas. Michael's recognition by Mayor Goodman is due to his mural at the Fashion Show Las Vegas titled, *Be Kind To Bugs*.

VEZUN






