The Salon's origins come from Louis XIV sponsoring an art exhibition at the Salon d'Apollon of the Louvre Palace in Paris; it eventually became a prestigious annual event curated by a jury system. However, the Salon de Refusé formed in response to the prestigious exhibition as many artists who were considered cutting edge and modern were juried out of the Salon exhibition. The Salon of the Refused was first held in 1863 in Paris by command of Napoleon III for those who had been refused by the jury of the official Salon because their art didn't fit the expectations of the French Government. This marked the first time democratic principles guided an exhibition with the idea that anyone who had a vision and interest in being an artist could be one - principles we still hold firm. To be included in the Salon de Refusé is to share one's vision with the world regardless of standards set forth by jurors, academicians, kings or government.

## Juried Fine Art Competition for Adults Age 50 and Better

#### What you need to know:

- By entering Celebrating Life, the artist agrees to leave their work up through the end of the exhibition date.
   No artist can remove their artwork without consent of the city staff.
- Open to residents in Clark, Esmeralda, Lincoln, Mineral and Nye Counties. Artwork must be hand delivered or shipped to the address on this form. If shipping the work, the costs of round trip shipping are at the artist's expense and must be pre-paid. Must arrive by 5 p.m. May 3, 2023.
- Artists aged 50 and better are eligible to participate.
- No entry fee.
- Only one artwork per artist.
- Artwork must have been completed within the past three years and not previously juried into Celebrating Life.
- There will be a Salon des Refusés for all work not juried into the main exhibit.
- City galleries cannot take responsibility for work that exceeds \$1.500 in listed value.

#### Size limits and preparing artwork:

- Artwork must be ready for immediate display if selected for exhibition.
- All parts of the artwork must be secured to adjacent parts. For example, sculptures must be securely glued or welded together.
- All two-dimensional work must have a wire secured to the back, ready for hanging.
- Two-dimensional: not to exceed 42" in either direction, including frame.
- Three-dimensional: not to exceed 16" wide or 22" high.
- A pedestal and vitrine will be provided for threedimensional work selected for the exhibition.
- Sculpture cannot exceed 80 lbs.

#### The juror will select the artwork and award winners for the final exhibition.

- City of Las Vegas employees are not eligible to apply.
- City staff retains the right to disqualify any entries that do not meet entry requirements; this includes, but not limited to, size and weight limits.
- Artwork entered in this exhibition must take the audience into consideration and be appropriate for all ages to enjoy. City of Las Vegas staff have the right to refuse artwork based on audience suitability.

#### **Mary Warner**

Mary Warner is a visual artist, educator and curator. Born and raised in Northern California, she has lived in Chicago and New York City and taught at the University of Montana, Oklahoma State University and UT San Antonio before finally settling in Las Vegas in 1989. She retired from her position as head of painting in the Art Department at UNIV in 2011 and is now Professor Emeritus

Over the years she has received an N.E.A. Individual Fellowship; a Mid America Arts Alliance Fellowship and two Nevada Arts Council Individual Fellowships; and the 2011 Governors Art Award for Excellence in the Arts. Warner's work has been featured in 43 solo exhibitions nationally and she has participated in 55 exhibitions across the state. Her work has been exhibited widely outside the state including the Whitney Museum, The Drawing Center and the Louis K Meisel gallery in New York.

As an artist and curator, Mary Warner has been critical to the development of the local arts community. She was one of the founding members of CAC. She alternated between president and vice president in its formative years. She served for many years on the exhibition committee.
