Submitted herewith is the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2026, Final Budget of the City of Las Vegas Redevelopment Agency and Tax Increment Area.

This budget contains a Debt Service Fund, which requires property tax revenues totaling \$43,850,000 and a tax rate of \$3.2782. The apportionment to the Agency is \$2.4298 per \$100 of assessed valuation of \$2,329,499,897.

The property tax rates computed herein are based on preliminary data. If the final state computations require an adjustment to the rates of the affected overlapping entities, the rate certified for the Agency is to be the sum of those adjusted rates.

This budget contains two governmental funds with estimated expenditures of \$113,590,139.

Copies of this budget have been filed for public record and inspection in the offices enumerated in NRS 354.596 (Local Government Budget Act).

To the Chairman of the Board, Board of Directors, Redevelopment Area Property Owners, Residents, and Stakeholders of the Las Vegas Redevelopment Agency:

I am pleased to present the Final Redevelopment Agency Budget (RDA) for fiscal year 2026. The Redevelopment Agency was established by adoption of the Redevelopment Plan by Ordinance 3218, on March 5, 1986, in conformity with Nevada Community Redevelopment Law (NRS 279). The principal purpose of the Agency is to foster the revitalization of the urban core districts and surrounding neighborhoods. The city of Las Vegas currently has two designated redevelopment areas:

- Redevelopment Area 1 encompasses 3,948 acres. The area generally includes the greater downtown Las Vegas area east of Interstate 15, south of Washington Avenue, north of Sahara Avenue and west of Maryland Parkway. It also includes the commercial corridors along Charleston Boulevard, Martin Luther King Boulevard, and Eastern Avenue.
- Redevelopment Area 2 spans almost 1,050 acres covering Sahara Avenue from Interstate 15 to Decatur Boulevard, Charleston from Rancho Drive to Rainbow Boulevard and Decatur from Sahara to U.S. Route 95/Interstate 515.

The RDA provides assistance programs for companies located within the Redevelopment Areas. In 2015, the Nevada Legislature extended the life of Redevelopment Area 1 until 2046, which has enabled the Agency to continue to reverse the negative impacts resulting from the economic downturn. Per state statute, portions of the property tax revenue received by the Redevelopment Agency are set aside to be distributed to education (9%) and affordable housing (9%). The improvements in the local economy, combined with past efforts by the Redevelopment Agency to cut expenses and maximize private-sector investment, have yielded positive results and have helped the Redevelopment Agency maintain its investment-grade credit rating.

Some of the Agency's recent major accomplishments include:

- The Redevelopment Agency continues to see significant progress on many projects such as:
  - Symphony Park AC by Marriott/Element developed by Jackson Shaw, a 440 room convention hotel with 20,000 square feet of meeting space; Opening Fall 2025.
  - West Las Vegas Library at Enterprise Park, a 35,000 square foot state of the art library.
  - SHARE Downtown Historic Westside developed by Cherry Development, consisting of 102 units of workforce housing, 6,000 square feet of commercial space, and a 6,500 square foot market hall.
  - Southern Land's Arts District Development, consisting of 3 buildings with 337 apartments,
     10,000 square feet of commercial space, and parking garages.
  - Cedar Street's Arts District Development, a 311-unit apartment complex, 5,000 square feet of ground floor retail space, and parking.
  - Southern Lands Parcel Symphony Park C&D Development, which will be a 5-story multifamily building consisting of 275 studios, 1-, and 2-bedroom apartments wrapped around a parking garage, and a 22-story 265-unit apartment building, additional parking, and 14,000 square feet of commercial space; Opening Fall 2025
  - Southern Lands Symphony Park midrise building, which will be a 22-story building with 265 apartments, 14,000 square feet of commercial space, and parking; Opening Fall 2025.

- The Redevelopment Agency is also excited about recent and near-term future expected ground breakings for:
  - o Red Ridge's Symphony Park Parcel E Development, a 30 story 240-unit for sale condominium tower with a 30,000 square foot grocery retail space, 150 rental apartments, 40,000 square feet of office space, 20,000 square feet of ground floor retail, and a 700-stall parking garage, with a festival street. The project broke ground April 2025.
  - Las Vegas Museum of Art, a 90,000 square foot modern art museum supported by the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA) with Elaine Wynn as a major donor. This project is expected to break ground in 2026.
  - o ISO Development with the Mojave Group in the Arts District, which will be 279 apartments, 97 hotel suites, and 2,800 square feet of commercial space.
  - Z-Life Midtown in the Arts District, which will be a 174-unit apartment complex, 214 hotel rooms, 7,916 square feet for food and beverage, 7,954 square feet of commercial space, and 15,300 square feet of office space. This project broke ground April 2025.
  - McCormack Baron Salazar redevelopment of Desert Pines Golf Course, mixed income apartments, for sale homes, community centers, commercial, parks and recreation space; breaking ground in 2026.
- The Redevelopment Agency continued to assist property owners through its residential incentive programming. Over the past fiscal year, the agency leveraged funds to assist two businesses with incentives, 419 & 421 13<sup>th</sup> LLC and RP Kimzo 241 Holdings LLC with project investments of \$52,000 and \$168,000 respectively.
- The Agency continued to assist property owners through its commercial incentive programming. Over the past fiscal year, the agency leveraged \$2.4 million in funds to assist six businesses with incentives DROCK 3<sup>rd</sup> St, LLC, Omelet House, LLC, Charleston OZB, LLC, Swan Dive Las Vegas, LLC, Able Baker, and the Doberman LLC.
- The agency also launched its Electrical Utility Incentive Program and the first participant T-UPR II LLC had a project investment of \$556,000.

In fiscal year 2025, the Redevelopment Agency saw a projected 19.7% increase in incremental assessed values and a 9.8% increase in tax increment revenue. For fiscal year 2026, we are projecting an incremental assessed value decrease of 0.2% with a 12.3% increase in tax increment revenue

These revenue increases will help support the Agency's current budget priorities for fiscal year 2026:

- Funding Support for Hundred Plan in Action projects in the Historic Westside
- Parking Program Support
- Utilities Incentives
- Visual Improvement Program
- Multifamily Improvement Program
- Business Security Program
- Civic Plaza Development
- Build-out of the Las Vegas Medical District
- Continued redevelopment in Symphony Park<sup>TM</sup>

We are submitting this budget in accordance with the laws of the State of Nevada.

The City of Las Vegas' management continues to be committed to improving customer service, improving the efficiency of the Agency's operations, and improving the quality of services. We will continue to be financially conservative in the execution of this budget. We will also stay in tune with the economy and our residents and other stakeholders to ensure we are meeting community needs. I believe this budget advocates this philosophy along with the strategic direction from the Governing Board, and creates a sound expenditure plan for this next year.
