STATISTICS

Traffic Statistics:



- More than 38,000 people die every year in crashes on U.S. roadways
- 4.4 Million are injured seriously enough to require medical attention
- Road crashes are the leading cause of death in the U.S. for people aged 1-54

STATISTICS

Traffic Statistics:



- 2020 U.S. Vehicle Miles Traveled decreased by 430.2 Billion Miles (13.2% Decrease)
- 2020 U.S. Traffic Fatalities increased to 38,680 (7.2% Increase) increase in vehicle, pedestrian, bicyclist, and motorcycle fatalities
- Main concerns: Speeding, Impaired Driving, Failure to Wear Seat Belt

WHAT IS VISION ZERO?

Vision Zero is a strategy to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries, while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all. First implemented in Sweden in the 1990s, Vision Zero has proved successful across Europe – and now it's gaining momentum in major American cities.

REACTIVE vs. PROACTIVE

TRADITIONAL APPROACH

Traffic deaths are INEVITABLE

PERFECT human behavior

Prevent COLLISIONS

INDIVIDUAL responsibility

Saving lives is **EXPENSIVE**

VISION ZERO

Traffic deaths are PREVENTABLE

Integrate **HUMAN FAILING** in approach

Prevent FATAL AND SEVERE CRASHES

SYSTEMS approach

SUCCESS STORIES

Oslo, Norway:

- Population = 673,000 (651,000 in Las Vegas)
 - 2019 Pedestrian Fatalities = 0
 - 2019 Bicyclist Fatalities = 0
 - 2019 Children Fatalities = 0



- 2019 Total Traffic Fatalities = 1 (Driver hit fence)
- Lowered Speeds, No Car Zones, Expanded Bike Network, Traffic Calming Around Schools



SUCCESS STORIES

Hoboken, New Jersey (Population 54,000):

- Zero Traffic Fatalities for 3 Straight Years
- Prioritized:
 - Bike Lane Infrastructure
 - Committed to Pedestrian-Oriented City
- Street Re-Design:
 - Curb Extensions
 - Bike Lanes
 - Recalibrated Traffic Signals
 - Wider Crosswalks Retro-Reflective, Thermoplastic Stripes





LAS VEGAS COMPARISON

City of Las Vegas, NV:

- Population = 651,000 in Las Vegas
 - 2014-2018
 - Pedestrian Fatalities = 73
 Severe Injuries = 174
 - Bicyclist Fatalities = 8
 Severe Injuries = 53
 - Motorcycle/Moped Fatalities = 51Severe Injuries = 218
 - Total Traffic Fatalities = 253
 Severe Injuries = 921



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LAS VEGAS VISION ZERO ACTION PLAN

The City of Las Vegas Vision Zero Action Plan will develop strategies to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries by the year 2050. The Vision Zero Action Plan will be a collaborative effort, combining City of Las Vegas, elected officials, safety stakeholders, and public outreach to create safe, healthy, and equitable mobility for all.

ZERO FATALITIES vs. VISION ZERO



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- NDOT has made great strides
 - Zero Fatalities is Statewide and focuses on all roadway classifications
- Vision Zero will build off of Zero Fatalities
 - Focus on Las Vegas urban environment



1. Enhance processes and collaboration between the City of Las Vegas and Stakeholders (YOU)





2. Create safe streets for all, specifically protect vulnerable users and give equal importance to all modes of travel and all citizens







3. Create safe speeds





4. Develop and promote a culture of safety through new public dialogue on street safety





5. Improve and respond to relevant data by being transparent and responsive





6. Adopt policies and legislation to advance the Vision Zero Action Plan






7. Review other city's best practices and coordinate with the City's Planning Division to help develop new street design standards and regulations for the RTC to possibly adopt to advance the Vision Zero Action Plan





8. Incorporate Vision Zero Action Plan action items into the RTC's Regional Transportation Plan / Transportation Improvement Program (RTP/TIP)
