

WHAT IS VISION ZERO?

Vision Zero is a strategy to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries, while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all. First implemented in Sweden in the 1990s, Vision Zero has proved successful across Europe – and now it's gaining momentum in major American cities.

LAS VEGAS CRASHES

City of Las Vegas, NV (2014 – 2018)

- Pedestrian Fatalities = 73
 Severe Injuries = 174
- Bicyclist Fatalities = 8
 Severe Injuries = 53
- Motorcycle/Moped Fatalities = 51
 Severe Injuries = 218
- Total Traffic Fatalities = 253 (> 50 per Year)
 Severe Injuries = 921 (> 180 per Year)






