



## Biltmore Bungalow Survey

	<p>The Commission for the Las Vegas Centennial awarded funds to the Nevada Preservation Foundation in the amount of \$27,400 for the costs associated with conducting an in-depth historic resource survey of the Biltmore Additions, a neighborhood also referred to as the Biltmore Bungalows. The surveyed area is roughly bounded by Washington Avenue and Bonanza Road to the north and south, and Las Vegas Boulevard and North First Street to the east and west. The intent of the survey was to establish the neighborhood's significance for local, state and national historic register nominations.</p> <p>The homes were constructed between 1941 and 1946, the majority of which were built in the Federal Housing Administration prescribed Minimal Traditional architectural style. The findings in the survey determined that the neighborhood retains its distinctive history and contains historic value as it is representative of World War II era residential development in the city of Las Vegas.</p> <p>The Biltmore Additions Survey Report is available from the city of Las Vegas.</p>
