	<p>The Centennial Commission provided funding for the city to hire Kutz Environmental Consultants to complete an architectural and historical resource survey of homes located in the Charleston Heights neighborhood, roughly bounded by Rainbow Boulevard, Charleston Boulevard, Vegas Drive and Valley View Boulevard.</p> <p>The area developed between the 1950s and 1960s in response to a demand for housing driven by the postwar economic and baby boom, Las Vegas' thriving hospitality and defense industries, and the general development of suburbia in America. The housing architectural styles are generally mid-century Contemporary and Ranch. The neighborhood includes relatively intact areas that clearly reflect the development and architectural trends at play during the 1950s and 60s.
