	<p>Slicktion Culture Productions was awarded a grant of \$294,250 for the costs associated with producing a documentary film about Paul Revere Williams and his work in Las Vegas.</p> <p>The film titled <i>Upside Down: Paul Revere Williams in Las Vegas</i> recounts the life of Williams, the first Black member of the American Institute of Architects, as well as the Institute's first Black Fellow. The film highlights his successes and struggles operating as an architect during the 1940s through the 1960s, including designing the Berkley Square Neighborhood, and the La Concha Motel lobby, known today as Neon Museum Visitor Center. The documentary also spotlights Williams' future visions of architecture for the city of Las Vegas.</p> <p>The film is scheduled for release at the end of 2025.</p>
