	<p>Branch No. 1 Las Vegas Grammer School, now known as the Historic Westside School, 330 West Washington Avenue, built in 1923, is the oldest surviving schoolhouse in Las Vegas. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the State Register of Historic Places, and the Las Vegas Historic Property Register. The Centennial Commission funded a renovation of the school.</p> <p>A grant of \$250,000 to the City of Las Vegas in 2008 funded an investigation of the school's structural integrity and various upgrades and rehabilitation needs; \$300,000 in 2011 contributed to the <u>Historic Westside School Master Plan</u>; annual bonding from 2011-2016 in the amount of \$500,000, totaling \$3 million, carried out the implementation of the plan; and \$15,000 in 2016 was for material and fabrication of metal gates at the school.</p> <p>Another grant of \$43,879 was awarded to Principium, a Nevada non-profit organization no longer in operation, to fund repairs to the exterior of the building in 2008.</p> <p>Westside School was among the American Public Works Association's Public Works Projects of the Year for 2018 in the category of Historical Restoration/Preservation</p>
