## HUNDRED Plan for Historic Westside Community

	<p>The Centennial Commission awarded two grants of \$106,900 and \$30,000 which contributed to the development of the HUNDRED (Historic Urban Neighborhood Design Redevelopment) Plan, a research and community-based neighborhood proposal for the Historic Westside community in Las Vegas. Under the direction of UNLV, a multidisciplinary project team of students, faculty, and consultants was formed to listen to and establish the community's vision through a series of neighborhood meetings.
