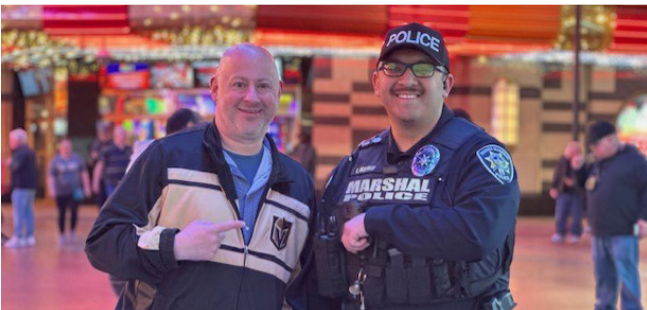


◆ PROACTIVE, EVIDENCE-BASED POLICING

The Deputy City Marshals integrate evidence-based strategies into their daily deployment model. This includes the use of hot spot policing and the Koper Curve method—directing short, high-visibility patrol intervals in micro-locations with a history of crime. This model maximizes deterrence and ‘felt presence’ while allowing for efficient coverage of key locations across the city. Research shows that 15-20-minute patrols sporadically every few hours in hotspots has a residual deterrent effect on perceptions of crime and disorder.

The Marshals are uniquely positioned for this approach due to their non-call-stacking patrol model, allowing officers to provide a consistent presence and maintain strong community engagement in assigned hotspot areas.



◆ COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND VISIBILITY

Deputy City Marshals regularly engage with the public through our Citizen’s Police Academy and Citizen’s Advisory Board as well as

- Foot and bike patrols in high-traffic pedestrian corridors
- Safety presentations and events in city parks and schools
- Business engagement and ordinance education in entertainment districts

By building trust and maintaining a visible presence, the intent is for the Marshals to play a key role in fostering safe and vibrant public spaces across the city.

◆ 21ST CENTURY POLICING

Our employees are our greatest asset, and we are committed to developing officers with strong minds and bodies. Guided by the principles of the 21st Century Task Force on Policing, our focus areas include ~ Building Trust, Confidence and Legitimacy, Employee Health and Wellness, Sound Policy, Innovative Technology, Consistent Training, Crime Reduction and Community Engagement, Hiring, Staffing and Retention.

◆ WHY WE SERVE – STRONGER TOGETHER



The city of Las Vegas Deputy City Marshals serve with purpose, pride and a deep commitment to the communities, businesses and visitors who depend on the safety and security of city spaces. We are more than law enforcement officers—we are guardians of public places, ambassadors of city values – kind, committed and smart, and

problem-solvers who believe in proactive, respectful, constitutional and community-based policing.

Our service is rooted in the belief that safe, clean, and welcoming public spaces are the foundation of a vibrant city. Whether patrolling parks, trails, city buildings or the downtown tourist corridor, our role is to ensure that residents and visitors feel safe and supported. We will continue to be strong partners to LVMPD and our allied agencies and are proud to contribute to public safety in this world-class city.

We understand that today's public safety challenges require more than enforcement—they require compassion, visibility, and trust. That's why we emphasize engagement, accountability, and innovation in everything we do. From our use of evidence-based patrol models to our partnerships with outreach and mental health services, the Deputy City Marshals have an emphasis to policing that puts people and places first.

We serve because we believe in the mission of the city of Las Vegas. We serve because we know that every conversation, every ordinance enforced, and every presence-driven patrol makes a difference – opportunities for deposits – not withdrawals. Fighting crime is and always will be community-based. We are driven by constitutional and principled policing in that we derive our consent from the people we serve – not necessarily the authority that we wield.

◆ SPECIALIZED UNITS AND TEAMS

The Deputy City Marshals are organized into several specialized units that address the unique and evolving needs of the community:

CONDITIONS TEAM

The Conditions Team focuses on chronic quality-of-life issues such as unlawful lodging, trespassing, vandalism, and public nuisance activity in city parks, trails, and properties. Our Conditions Team are highly trained in crime prevention, and many of our officers serve on the dignitary detail and our elite Special Response Team. Officers in this team also work closely with the MORE Team, Homeless Outreach, and Code Enforcement to achieve long-term resolutions and help connect individuals to services.



MOTORS UNIT

The Motors Team provides traffic enforcement in high-density pedestrian zones and supports major events. Their focus includes patrolling our city parks, washes and trails.



POP TEAM (PROBLEM-ORIENTED POLICING)

The POP Team is responsible for long-term problem-solving and community engagement in our tourist corridor. Using data-driven strategies, officers



identify recurring crime trends and collaborate with residents, businesses and internal city partners to address the underlying root causes of crime. POP Team efforts are focused on prevention, intervention, education and sustainable enforcement.



CIS TEAM (CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS SECTION)

The CIS Team handles follow-up investigations into crimes occurring on city properties, including battery, burglaries, and significant property crimes. These investigators support patrol officers with evidence gathering, victim/witness coordination, case filings and liaison work with other law enforcement agencies and the District Attorney's Office. We have task force officers assigned to Fusion Watch Center, a part-time task force officer with the U.S. Marshals Office and a full-time Task Force Officer with the Drug Enforcement Administration.

K9 UNIT – VAPOR WAKE DETECTION

Our K9 Unit specializes in Vapor Wake detection, a cutting-edge approach to explosive detection that follows the airborne scent trail of moving threats. K9 teams are regularly deployed for proactive sweeps of high-traffic areas such as the Fremont Street Experience, City Hall and event venues to ensure public safety and homeland security preparedness.
